### SHIPPING POLICY

We are proud of the fast, dependable service that we offer. If your order cannot be filled and shipped within 3 working days, we will let you know what the problem is and when you can expect delivery. Whenever possible we will ship via UPS, however, if you use a post office box as a return address we are forced to use Parcel Post (It is slower and more costly.)

For orders shipped via UPS to the lower 48 states our policy is to charge 6% of the merchandise amount for shipping and handling with a minimum of \$1.50 and a maximum of \$10.00 in ID, \$15.00 in WA, OR, MT, and WY, and a maximum of \$25.00 in the other states.

For orders shipped via Parcel Post our policy is to charge 10% of the merchandise amount for shipping and handling with a minimum of \$2.50 and a maximum of \$25.00.

All orders that include rafts, frames or long ash oars (8' or longer) will be shipped collect via motor freight (FOB Moscow, Idaho.) You pay the delivering carrier for freight. For estimates on charges consult your local freight company or check with us. Orders over \$1000.00 to the lower 48 states are shipped freight free - we pick up the tab.



# RAFTS

All raft manufacturers try to incorporate desirable design features into their boats. Length, width, tube diameter, bow and stern rise, weight — all affect the handling characteristics of a raft. Since there are differences of opinion about how best to achieve these desirable characteristics, there are now many different types and styles of boats on the market.

Though material comparisons are complicated, they fall into three main categories: fabric, coating, and weight. The base fabric provides the material strength and resistance to tearing while the coating provides the air tightness, abrasion resistance, and determines the material longevity. Generally speaking - the higher the denier count: 210, 420, 840, etc., the greater the tear strength of the material. However, in some cases the threads can be woven like rope, and this complicates the analysis.

Hypalon coating has the greatest resistance to abrasion and deterioration of any commercially available synthetic rubber. The correct use of the term hypalon requires that the coating be at least 50% hypalon - the higher the percent the greater the abrasion resistance (this increase must have a limit but we're not sure where.) Most top quality boats are manufactured from hypalon material; Campways for example, uses hypalon on the exterior for strength and resistance to weathering and blended rubber compounds on the interior for adhesion and air tightness.




Many different rubber compounds are used in coating fabric for rafts. Rafts that we formerly said had cheap neoprene coatings (ie. the Yellow Duckies) generally had **no** neoprene at all in their coatings. (Neoprene is expensive, but not as expensive as hypalon.) Since most rubber compounds can have several formulations, most rafts contain blends including EDPM, natural rubber, and other compounds, which combined have the cost/quality desired by the manufacturer.

Weight (ozs. per sq. yd.) is important but should be considered in conjunction with fabric denier and coating type when making your decision. To simplify your questions about how rafts compare to each other, we have included a keyed diagram for your use. All rafts included in this catalog are described

in the terms shown in the diagram. All raft prices are subject to change without notice.

### **UDISCO**

UDISCO's imported boats have recently improved in design and quality. We like them. All UDISCO boats have grey tubes and black floors and are manufactured in a material that UDISCO says is Hypalon/Nylon, implying that it is nylon fabric with hypalon coating. We feel the coating is actually a blend of hypalon and various rubber compounds but it holds up well no matter what you call it. If after a few years it starts to weather, we recommend a coat of neoprene paint to improve durability.





#### 106 6-MAN UDISCO

This boat has the same dimensions and almost the same specifications as the 1978 NRS SPRITE. Two cross thwarts give this excellent small raft an amazing amount of internal support, making it a practical 4-person paddleboat without a frame. When using a frame we recommend 7' or 71/2' oars, depending on your frame design. This boat is well suited for day use as a paddle boat or for short trips with a day frame. (We have run most of Idaho's rivers in this raft.) Specifications are: 11' long, 5'2" wide, 151/2" dia. main tubes, two 14" dia. thwarts, 6" bow rise, flat stern with motor mount straps, center compartment is 31" wide by 27" long, 6 air chambers, with small brass valves, rubber oarlocks, lightweight lifeline, 420 denier 30 oz. blended rubber compound material. Approx. weight 55 lbs. \$310.00

### 108 8-MAN UDISCO

The need for a slightly larger paddle raft is met very well by UDISCO's 8-man raft. Because of the stern lift, it is also an excellent small, rowing raft. The slightly greater size and tube diameter contribute to its popularity and cause some customers to prefer it to the less expensive 6-man. The larger stern compartment provides decent gear storage capacity too. We recommend 7½' or 8' oars for this raft. Specifications are: 12' long, 5'8" wide, 16" dia. main tubes, two 14" dia. thwarts, 6" bow and stern rise, 6 air chambers with military style valves, rubber oarlocks and lifeline. 420 denier 30 oz. blended rubber compound. Approx. weight 65 lbs.




### LARGE UDISCO RAFTS

These hoats have been improved each year and now have many features previously only found in the top of the line Avons and Campways. UDISCOS are equipped with six air chambers for safety and convenience. The large military style valves offer easy and fast inflation. The new 10 & 14 man models have the advantage of greater beam (6'3" & 6'8") and laced in thwarts. Laced in thwarts have an excellent reputation for air tightness and can also be removed if you wish to build a special frame. The 420 Denier fabric and combination hypalon/rubber compounds coating holds up well and makes these an excellent choice for someone needing carrying capacity on a limited budget.

#### 110 10-MAN UDISCO

This is a medium sized raft that is often paddled with 4 to 6 people or a boatman and gear for 4 to 6 kayakers. The 10" bow and stern rise give it a good handling characteristics and the 18" tubes provide enough capacity for most uses. We suggest 8 to 9 ft oars with this raft, and recommend 8½ Carlisle wide blades. Specifications are: 14' long, 6'3" wide, 18" dia. main tubes, 15" dia. laced-in thwarts, 10" bow and stern rise, center compartment is 39" wide by 42" long, 6 large military style valves, 420 denier 30 oz. blended rubber compound material. Approx. wieght 75 lbs. \$435.00





#### 111 10-MAN PACKAGE

The 10-man package includes #110 10-man raft, #160 Universal frame, #206 NRS foot pump, 5 ea. #311 Unglued D-rings, 1 pint Carboline adhesive, one spare blade and either three 81/2 ft. wide-blade Carlisle oars set up for Pins & Clips (includes 1 set #285 Pins & Clips and 1 #286 Extra clip assembly) or three 81/2 ft. standard-blade Carlisle oars set up for open oarlocks (includes 1 pair #280 Manganese bronze oarlocks, 1 pair #284 Hairpin cotters, 3 #295 Rubber oar stoppers and 3 #297 Rubber sleeve assemblies). #### 114 14-MAN UDISCO

This used to be my favorite raft because it's the best buy for someone on a limited budget that needs a big boat. The 11" bow and stern rise makes it easy to row and even when heavily loaded it's pretty maneuverable because the large PAD (center area) keeps it from sinking down too far. The raised bow lets you ride over the transition at the bottom of a chute or falls, and the raised stern not only shortens the waterline and makes the raft more maneuverable, but keeps the stern from getting swamped in big water. We suggest 9 to 10 ft oars with this raft. (With a light load the 9 ft Carlisle wide-blades will really move this boat.) Specifications are: 16' long, 6'8" wide, 21" dia. main tubes, 17" dia. laced-in thwarts, center compartment is 38" wide by 56" long, 6 military style valves, 420 denier 30 oz. blended rubber compound material. Approx. weight 90 lbs. \$530.00

### 115 14-MAN PACKAGE

The 14-man package includes #114-man raft, #160 Universal frame, #206 NRS foot pump, 5 ea. #311 Unglued D-rings, 1 pint Carboline adhesive, one spare blade and either three 9 ft. wide-blade Carlisle oars set up for Pins & Clips (includes 1 set #285 Pins & Clips and 1 #286 Extra clip assembly) or three 9 ft. standard-blade Carlisle oars set up for open oarlocks (includes 1 pair #280 Manganese bronze oarlocks, 1 pair #284 Hairpin cotters, 3 #195 Rubber oar stoppers and 3 #297 Rubber sleeve assemblies). #### CAMPWAYS

Here are some specifics about the 1980 Campways' boats. They have recessed hivolume Nylon valves and raised bow and sterns. The fabric is a high hypalon content coating on a high strength nylon fabric (420 or 840 denier, depending on the boat). Over the years, Campways has worked diligently to improve the quality of their boats and the present workmanship is excellent. All Campways boats include mounted D-rings and repair kits. #### RIVER RIDERS

The River Riders, Campway's newest entries into the medium priced boat field, have a raised bow and stern in an asymmetrical shape reminiscent of the early Avons (pointed bow and blunt stern.) Many people have praised these boats highly, and we believe they deserve the praise as efficient boats that handle well. Excellent boats at less cost than the other Campways rafts, they should still be trouble free to operate.

#### 120 RIVER RIDER - 13

With paddles or oars, this versatile boat gives a good ride and is just right for smaller parties (it can even double as a fishing boat motor not included!). Specifications are: 5'10" wide by 13'1" long, 17" dia. main tubes, 15" dia. thwarts, 11" bow rise, 6" stern rise. Center compartment is 36" wide by 40" long, 4 air chambers with military style valves, 420 denier 35 oz. hypalon tube material, 37 oz. floor material. Includes 9 mounted D-rings and repair kit, weighs approx. 85 lbs. \$750.00

#### 121 RIVER RIDER - 14

Need a boat for a variety of rivers that has stability, carrying capacity, and durability? Then try the River Rider-14. It's at home in big water, yet responsive and maneuverable. Specifications are: 6'6" wide by 13'6" long, 19" dia. main tubes, 16" dia. thwarts, 11" bow rise, 6" stern rise. Center compartment is 40" wide by 40" long, 4 air chambers with military style valves, 420 denier 35 oz. hypalon tube material, 37 oz. floor material. Really a stubby rascal, the Miwok is 5" wider than the 10-man, but is 6" shorter. The Miwok has become a very popular boat for private parties on the rivers of the Northwest. A perfect raft for many uses, we like it because it'll carry 4 people and gear, and still keep its excellent handling characteristics when heavily loaded. For 1980 the Miwok comes in a 37 oz., 840 denier hypalon material that is very puncture resistant. We use 9' or 10' oars on the Miwok. (I prefer the Aluminum 9' wide-blade.) Specifications are: 13'6" long, 6'8" wide, 19" dia. main tubes, 17" dia. thwarts, 10" bow and stern rise, center compartment 42" wide by 42" long, 6 air chambers with large recessed valves, 37 oz. hypalon tube material, 60 oz. floor material. Includes

12 mounted D-Rings, Campways foot pump and a repair kit. Weight 130 lbs., shipped prepaid, freight free. \$1,650.00

#### 124 MIWOK PACKAGE

The Miwok Package includes #121 Miwok, #160 Universal frame, Campways foot pump, one spare blade and either three 9 ft. wideblade Carlisle oars set up for Pins & Clips (includes 1 set #285 Pins & Clips and 1 #286 Extra clip assembly) or three 9 ft. standard-blade Carlisle oars set up for open oarlocks (includes 1 pair #280 Manganese bronze oarlocks, 1 pair #284 Hairpin cotters, 3 #295 Rubber oar stoppers and 3 #297 Rubber sleeve assemblies.) Most boatmen really load this boat down and so prefer to use 10' oars. Specifications are: 16'3" long, 6'11" wide, 20" dia. main tubes, 18" dia. thwarts, 11" bow and stern rise, center compartment 42" wide by 50" long, 6 air chambers with large recessed valves, 840 denier 37 oz. Hypalon tube material, 60 oz. floor material. Includes 12 mounted D-rings, Campways foot pump, and a repair kit. Weight 145 lbs. Shipped prepaid -\$1,900.00 we pay the freight.

#### 126 SHOSHONI PACKAGE



Last year they completely redesigned their river boats with a new symmetrical design (they feel it provides a more efficient use of cargo and people space.) Avons have an unmatched reputation for quality and durability (they are the only manufacturer that guarantees their boats for 1 year against defects in workmanship.) Their material also carries a five year guarantee against deterioration (it's the only material that is 100% hypalon on both the inside and outside) and is stronger and more durable than any other material of comparable weight. #### 135 ADVENTURER

The Adventurer design is particularly desirable for outfitters and large groups that paddle because it provides enough room for up to 8 paddlers. Its 18" dia. tubes also make it an excellent choice for use as a small personal rowing boat. We recommend 9' or 10' oars, depending on your frame choice. Specifications are: 14' long, 6'8" wide, 18" dia. main tubes, 15" dia. thwarts, 9" bow and stern rise, center compartment is 44" wide by 38" long, 36 oz. hypalon tubes, 40 oz. hypalon floor, 6 air chambers with recessed military type valves, 16 mounted D-rings and life line. Also includes repair kit and foot pump. Weight 99 lbs. Shipped prepaid - we pay the freight. \$2,100.00

#### 137 PROFESSIONAL

The Professional has design features that make it very attractive to private and professignal river runners. Its combination of good capacity, ride, easy handling, and unsurpassed durability have made the Professional the favorite boat for many western boaters. We recommend boatmen use 10' oars on the Pro. Specifications are: 16' long, 7'4" wide, 20" dia. main tubes, 16" dia. laced in thwarts, 11" bow and stern rise, center compartment is 48" wide by 45" long, 36 oz. hypalon tubes, 40 oz. hypalon floor, 6 air chambers with large/recessed military type valves, 16 mounted D-rings. Includes life line, bow and stern lines, repair kit and foot pump. weighs about 110 lbs., shipped prepaid. \$2,700.00



# FRAMES

#### 160 UNIVERSAL FRAME


This frame is really quite simple, there are two pods or side rails formed from steel tubing to fit over the raft's side tubes. Cross member sleeves and oarlock stand plates are welded to the pods. There is an "H" shaped rear seat cross piece with special adjustable form-fitting padded seat. I tried the new fitted seat and it is simply a great addition to a river trip because it is not only very comfortable but provides good "traction" in difficult water. In front the combination cooler cradle and foot brace assembly fits an 80 quart Gott cooler (#807) perfectly, but other coolers smaller than 35" x 17" will also fit. Oarlock stands are included and have a 6" adjustment to fit almost every size rafter. The frame fits together with just 4 fast pins (included) and can be assembled/disassembled in seconds. We pre-cut the side members to fit your raft, but because individual raft dimensions vary slightly, we ship the cross members undrilled. Merely assemble the frame on your raft and use a 5/16" bit to drill through the cross pieces at the appropriate points. The frame is painted with industrial enamel, but after a season or two it will probably need respraying to cover paint chips and wear spots. The entire assembly is 82" long by 69" to 72" (depends on the raft) wide and weighs 80 lbs. Fits most large rafts, please specify raft model when ordering \$300.00


#### 164 SUPER FRAME


We had a number of special orders last year for extra large frames to fit the Havasu, Spirits and Professional, so now we keep them in stock. This is a quality frame built to the same specifications as the Universal frame but sized and braced to fit the big rafts. The frame is 82" long and 77" to 84" wide, depending on the raft. Holds an Igloo 151 quart cooler. (#809) Please specify raft model. \$325.00

#### 166 TOURING FRAME

This year we are offering a lightweight one piece brazed steel frame. This Canham frame offers more gear space in the rear because it has a cargo deck over the back thwart (you sit on the cooler in front of the thwart.) As in all cooler-seat frames, the integral oarlock pivot points are slightly ahead of the raft center point (in my opinion a slight disadvantage.) This frame accepts an 80 qt. Gott cooler suspended from two straps. The double toe brace is kind of neat too; if you hit a big wave and get kicked back you will probably catch yourself on the top brace. We stock these frames to fit a limited number of rafts, please contact us for details. \$270.00







#### 168 ALUMINUM DAY FRAME

These heavy duty welded aluminum frames are light, serviceable, and easy to pack. They weigh less than 25 lbs. with the wood seat. The frame has integral oarlocks and a 10" drop foot brace and is designed to fit such smaller boats as the UDISCO 6 or 8-man and Avon Redshank. These boats lack space for coolers in front of the boatman so this frame is just the ticket for day use. Suitable for extended trip use if you make other arrangements for the cooler or do without. Please specify raft and we will size the frame to fit. An excellent buy at this price. Can only be shipped motor freight!

# OARS

## **ALUMINUM AND PLASTIC OARS**

Technology has really made an impact in one area of river running. Quality aluminum and plastic oars are here to stay! These aluminum oar shafts are very strong - yet still weigh less than ash, the 10 ft. length weighs only 71/2 lbs. - compared to 91/2 lbs. for ash. Carlisle Ausable Oars are manufactured with 6061-T6 aluminum shafts covered with ABS plastic sleeves, shaft diameter is 1-7/8". They have removable ABS plastic blades in two sizes (we can now ship 10 fts. via UPS.) Standard blade measures 51/2" x 26", the wide blade measures 8" x 26". Some of us who use these oars really loved them - one guide I met at the Main Salmon takeout was ecstatic about the wide-blade model - said one stroke was good for three on the Middle Fork - where every stroke counts. My friends who have used wide blades wouldn't even consider any other choice. These oars made believers of us - they are our first choice for any river trip. If you use pins and clips and want extra power in your stroke, use the wide blades. You can't use these with open oarlocks (unless your wrists are as big as most peoples necks) so, for open oarlocks use the standard blades. Don't store blades below freezing - the plastic can get brittle. The reason for the price jump from 8 ft. oars to 9 fts. is because all 9 ft. and longer shafts have extra reinforcement with inner aluminum sleeves.

202 BIG BLOWER


If you have access to 110 volt, 6.5 amp, AC or DC, this pump is the answer at a put in. It gives up to three pounds pressure and will inflate an Avon Spirit in under five minutes! 





The very best low-pressure gauges cost \$40.00, but these medium-pressure gauges do a very serviceable job with the more expensive rafts. Be careful, don't overfill your boat just because you have a pressure gauge. Fits all the rafts we carry except the #106 6-Man. \$18.00





#### ADHESIVES/THINNERS/COATINGS

No matter what the material or adhesive you use, the following steps should be followed when repairing a raft:

- 1) Prepare the surfaces (both boat and patch) by roughing it up, using a sand stone, rasp, sandpaper, or anything to abrade the surface.
- 2) Clean the surfaces with cleaner if possible (do not use an oil base solvent such as paint thinner.)
- 3) Apply the adhesive and wait (follow the directions because each type seems to require different drying times) the most common error is not letting adhesive dry enough.
- 4) After contact, press the surfaces together with a roller, the side of the adhesive can, or any other means you can come up with. The more forceful the contact, the better the bond. Best results are obtained if you allow the adhesive to dry beyond tacky dry.

We have found the Carboline F-1 Neoprene adhesive to be an excellent all-purpose one part adhesive for use with all types of hypalon, neoprene, and other rubber materials. It's what we use here in the store and on all of our river trips when we have problems. The 3 oz. tube is our choice of the way to carry adhesive because it doesn't dry out in the tube and is easy to pack (especially if you can get someone else in your party to carry a quart for major repairs.) It does tend to puncture though, so you should wrap it in a 6 oz. juice can or other protector. The 2-part Bostik adhesive is a little more difficult to work with than the Carboline - but Avon recommends it for use with their boats, so we offer it.

To prepare a raft for either patching or painting, the surface should be free from all traces of oil, dirt, beer, etc. Our thinner/cleaner does this quite well - but beware of the fumes. We feel painting a raft prolongs material life by providing abrasion resistance and offers protection from ozone and UV deterioration. Though the aluminum color reduces heat build-up more, the gray is stronger. The GACO Neoprene coating should be mixed with thinner/cleaner before vou roll or brush it on. (ratio 1 part thinner per 4 parts coating.) One gallon will do a large raft (tubes only - not the floor.) NOTE: All of these items are flammable and can only be shipped UPS or motor freight, so please do not ask us to mail them to you.





(Filing or polishing the inside of the horn is a good idea, too.) When using plastic oars, wrap the oarlock with ½" Nylon cord or use #297 Rubber sleeves. \$9.00 pr.





#### 285 PINS AND CLIPS

Pins and Clips are more popular in California and the Southwest than here in the Northwest, where horn oarlocks are still very popular. Pins and clips give you more confidence and power in your strokes, because they keep the blade vertical and position the oar. However, you can't feather the oars or readily pull them in so you lose some useful rowing maneuvers. This loss of flexibility and subtlety in rowing is a nuisance, but the few times you need a really powerful stroke more than makes up for those losses. Beginners overwhelmingly prefer these over open oarlocks. The set contains two %" dia. bolts, bushings, rubber safety bumpers, nuts and washers, plus the 2 clips and radiator clamps for fastening on the oar. \$24.00 set

#### 286 EXTRA CLIPS

When using our #285 Pins & Clips, spare oars must have clips mounted before use, so here they are. Includes 1 clip and 2 radiator clamps. \$8.00 ea.

### 290 OARLOCK STANDS

These stands are professionally designed and manufactured for heavy duty river use. They have a 5-1/4" x 5-1/2" steel base with 4 mounting holes and welded steel bracket that gives a 6" rise. The socket itself is %" dia., with a 14 degree outward tilt for correct oar alignment. The built-in rise and tilt make it much simpler to build a quality frame yourself. They can be used with any oarlock that has a %" dia. shaft.

#### 292 WYNN SOCKETS

Designed to be fastened to the outside of a wood block. Has an angle plate with holes for screws or bolts. These are a good set-up but not as heavy-duty as they should be for big rafts. Use with any %" dia. oarlock. \$2.50 pr.

#### 295 RUBBER STOPPERS

These rubber stoppers are used to keep the oar from sliding through the oarlock. Some people use a radiator hose clamp on the stopper shoulder to hold it in place, or you can glue or tape them into position (silicone rubber cement seems to be the best for gluing.) \$3.50 pr.

#### 296 PLASTIC STOPPERS

Adjustable oar stoppers made of heavy duty plastic with locking bolts on each side. Can be shaped to fit the oar and hold firmly (must be enlarged to fit aluminum/plastic oars.) Recommended as well worth the extra cost and effort. \$5.50 pr.

#### 297 RUBBER SLEEVES

Radiator hose is just the right product to cover Carlisle's Aluminum oars in open oarlocks. (Nylon rope is difficult to attach.) Slide the one-foot hose length over the end and glue in place with carboline adhesive or Sportsman's goop. \$4.00 ea.

#### 358 ¼" NYLON ROPE

To protect the oar from the oarlock, we suggest ¼" nylon rope (anything from ½" to ¾" will do,) wrapped tightly and tacked with very small brads. Always pull the rope ends under the wrap (make sure the ends are on the top of the wrap — not on the sides where they will interfere with the oarlock,) and then tack them down (too many brads or too large brads may weaken the oar.) This is what we wrap wooden oars with, usually 35' is needed per oar. Not recommended for plastic/aluminum oars.





#### 356 1/2" POLY-BRAIDED ROPE

We found this hollow braided rope to be the most practical rope on the market for a lifeline around the raft. Big enough to get a good grip on and yet easy to work with (braids back into itself to go around D's and tiedowns, etc.). Also good for general purpose rope if you don't feel %" is enough. Floats. #### 358 1/4" NYLON ROPE

# LIFE JACKETS

For lakes you might save some money and buy cheap vests at a discount house. For whitewater use — get something good! Type I is the universal commercial model 22 lbs. or more protection, should turn an unconscious person upright and slightly back. Type III are those jackets approved for recreational vessels. They provide 15 lbs or more bouyancy and have tendency to float a conscious person in vertical position. The whitewater jacket has a type V rating as a commercial river runner's jacket with 22 lbs flotation and also carries a Type III certificate.

#### 400 TYPE I LIFE JACKET

For maximum protection at a low cost, we offer the commercial all-vessel jacket (Mae West type.) These jackets have vinyl pouches filled with the kapok that provide at least 22 lbs. of flotation, wrap around straps and a middle clasp and an outer shell of orange nylon. All jackets of this type should be treated carefully (do not compress) to avoid puncturing the vinyl pouches. \$25.00

#### 361 RESCUE ROPE

California Rivers produces quality products, and this rescue rope is no exception. It's 60 feet of 2,000 lb. test 3/8" solid/braid rope in an orange nylon bag (it floats) that's always ready to throw. The snap-strap insures easy unhooking from the raft or canoe, both ends of the rope are treated with a non-slip material, and the bag keeps the rope out from under your feet. If you should miss with your first throw, then pull it back in and try again (no need to recoil the rope, water in the bag will provide enough weight to throw it a second time.) There are now a number of Rescue/Throw ropes on the market - but this one is the best and is well worth the few extra dollars. \$28.00

#### 363 THRO-LINE

The folks at Whitewater Sports spent a lot of time working on the details of this rescue line. Most importantly, they agreed that both the bag and the line should float, and they do! The Thro-line is 60 ft. of %" dia. 2700 lb. test polyester/polypropylene rope in a bright orange nylon bag with a ethafoam flotation ring in the bottom of the bag. The line not only floats, but it also has excellent grip when wet (something we feel is very important.) This bag may well be the best value for your money. \$20.00


### 375 OTTER BAG

The Otter Bag is another great idea from Dragonfly Designs. It ties onto a thwart or seat as a catch-all for all those items lying around the boat: sweaters, suntan lotion, empty beer cans, maps, etc. Designed for canoes, but great for rafts. Made of a 1.9 oz. rip-stop K-kote nylon with a firm backing for easy opening. Measures 15" x 12" - really practical. \$6.50



#### 376 VINYL GLOVES

These rafter's gloves are light, yet very strong, and provide a better grip than your bare hands. The coating seems to be the same stuff applied to tools to provide a good grip. We don't know how they do it, but the coated fabric breathes and provides reasonably good ventilation. They dry out quickly and so protect your hands without letting moisture cause blisters. Try them for canoeing too. Really a super deal because they last for hundreds of miles. Also provides some warmth for chilly days, but not much. Sizes: S, M, L and XL. \$5.00 pr.







#### 404 WHITEWATER LIFE JACKET

This Stearns jacket has a solid feel and performs well in the water. (Formerly the River Rafting Jacket) These Type III/V jackets are becoming very popular due to their greater dependability and comfort as compared to the #400 jacket. Two chest straps, side adjustment panels, and a third, lower adjustable strap provide a good fit and secure feeling. Coated orange nylon outer shell, solid foam filler that provides at least 22 lbs. flotation, and a padded foam filler collar that provides some behind-the-head protection when you're in the water. Large/XLarge size fits chest size 42" and over, Small/Medium fits everything under that (chest size 30-40) and in this latest model even fits the little people around 100 lbs. There is enough overlap that people close to the dividing line can use either

#### 410 DELIVERANCE LIFE JACKET

Deliverance - crummy name - good kayaking jacket. Perhaps not as good as the Type V's and I's, but more comfortable and pleasant to wear for any river use. Because of its comfort, it's being used a lot more now for every whitewater use, (rafting, kayaking, and canoeing.) This Stearns jacket has ribbed foam flotation (15½ to 17½ lbs flotation depending on size) in a nylon shell. The bottom section may be worn up (probably should be) for kayaking so you won't mess up on your roll. Has a good zipper, snap at the bottom and cloth tie at the waist. Gold or blue colors. XS (30-32), S (34-38), M (40-42), L (44-46), XL (48-50).

#### 415 BELTED AMERICAN LIFE JACKET

Many general purpose PFDs (Personal Flotation Devices) don't have a good body strap, something we believe is essential for their use in whitewater. The Stearns Belted American has a good design with a body strap, large zipper, and adequate adjustments and sizes to fit almost all adults. This is the best economical jacket that we could find on the market! Sizes: Petite: (32-34), Small: (36-38), Medium: (40-42), Large: (44-46) and X-Large: (48-50). #### 418 PEE WEE LIFE JACKET

A small version of the standard Stearns jacket, plus the added features of body/leg straps. USCG approved type III for recreational use; once your children are in these jackets the leg straps hold 'em in so there is no worry about the jacket coming off. Three sizes: Small fits ages 2-5, chest 20"-24", Medium fits ages 5-7, chest 24"-27", Large fits ages 7-9, chest size 27"-30". \$19.00

#### 419 KINDERGAARD LIFE JACKET


Our bags are well established now, but we're still working on improvements in both the design and production. This year we added more velcro to the closure, eliminated potential wear points on the bottom, improved the strap stitching and length, etc. While the quality keeps going up, the price unfortunately seems to be getting up there, too. In all of our bags we use a PVC covered/Dacron fabric which is extremely resistant to puncture, abrasion and weathering. We honestly believe these bags to be superior to any other bags on the market. Bags are guaranteed for one year against defects in material and workmanship for recreational use.


#### 420 **BILL'S BAG**

This year we again made some minor improvements and increased the size of the velcro tabs that are used to start the top seal. For a watertight bag, fill it with all your gear, press the tabs together, roll down a minimum of three folds and cinch down the top and side straps. This bag is large enough to provide room for even the worst packer with his big Sears-Roebuck sleeping bag. Careful packers who don't carry a lot of extra junk can get two people's personal gear into this bag. The bag has 2 adjustable carrying straps on the back that can also be used to tie the bag to a thwart or frame member. Material is a bright orange, 18 oz. PVC-covered dacron, dimensions are 13" x 16" x 32" high (measured packed full.)

#### 422 **BLUE BAG**

Most of us can pack all our personal gear into a Blue bag for even the most extended river trip. It's a handier size than the #420 Bill's bag, but not as much space for the money. To close the bag, press the velcro tabs together, roll the top down for a minimum of three folds and then cinch the straps tight. 18 oz. PVCcovered dacron, bright blue color. Whenever possible we will ship via UPS, however, if you use a post office box as a return address we are forced to use Parcel Post (It is slower and more costly.)

The Iliad paddle is the best handling, most durable paddle we have found, and for the serious whitewater kayaker, this should be the choice. The paddle has a slightly oval, high strength aircraft aluminum shaft covered with non-slip vinyl. The oval shape helps to orient your control hand. The blades are pressure molded fiberglass and measure 8½" x 22". This is the paddle I use and it has survived six years of Northwest boating; others we know of are in their 10th year of use. The 84" length seems to be the most popular, but length really is a matter of personal preference. Lengths: 82", 84", 86". 84" weighs 3 lbs. 2 oz. \$74.00

#### 602 ILIAD SPOON BLADE



Don't get sucked in by all that up to your chin, nose or forehead stuff. Choose a shorter, more comfortable length. Rafters will need the slightly longer lengths, particularly in a raft with large tubes.

#### 610 NRS CANOE PADDLE


Double-bladed paddles are far superior to single-bladed paddles for solo canoeing, and improve tandem paddling almost as much (also can be used in the small yellow duckie type rafts.) The big blades (8" x 20") and long length (107") of this paddle allow you to set up an easy rhythm and really move along in the water. 
**SALMON:** the Salmon is very maneuverable and has the high volume so desirable for use in big water. You can carry all your gear on a river such as the Salmon (guess where he found the name) and still not feel like you are paddling a log. Some big water boaters won't use any other model. Length: 13'2", beam: 23%", weight: 33 lbs.

LOCHSA: a smaller volume version of the Salmon in a fast medium/low volume boat. It has the same hull design as the Salmon, but superior ability to slice through "stoppers." If you don't need the carrying capacity of the Salmon, this boat may be the best answer. Length: 13'2", beam: 23-\%", weight: 31 lbs.

The big news though is the internal frame and seat system which distributes stresses and, most importantly, provides internal strength to protect the boater in a "wrap around" situation. # CANOES

**OLD TOWN:** Old Town is the longtime builder of quality canoes. They bring their same quiet quality to their ABS canoes as they have to their traditional wooden canoes.

OLTONAR TRIPPER: this is the boat Davidson and Rugge used in their Canadian Expedition Trips and it's a real joy to paddle. Oltonar is Old Town's special sandwich formulation of Foamed ABS and Polyethylene. The Old Town Tripper is a great boat for many uses. These boats have a strong vinyl gunwale, ash thwarts and ABS seats. This blending of the best materials for every use makes for an excellent all around boat for those who may carry camping gear and still expect some whitewater use. The Tripper is and is 15" deep (enough freeboard for the adventurous.)

**BLUE HOLE:** designed by engineers for whitewater use, the Blue Hole canoe has in the past few years carved out an impressive place as the best known and respected whitewater canoe. Their emphasis and advertising are on survival in the toughest conditions. They show boats wrapped around rocks and pulled off to little or no apparent damage.

**OCA-16:** this is the boat you see taking impossible drops with solo paddlers. It has an ABS Royalex hull with 6063 low temper aluminum gunnels (extra strength, yet will bend — not break.) A highly engineered boat for the whitewater enthusiast. 15'9" long, 34" beam, weighs 70 lbs.

MGA-17: Blue Hole's Mike Gault designed cruiser, is claimed by many to be the river expedition canoe. Its asymmetrical shape (elongated bow to cut the water) is unique. Handles well and is very easy to paddle. 17'6" long, 36" beam, weighs 85 lbs.

# INFLATABLES

Inflatable canoe/kayaks we can really recommend! Canoe/Kayak? They're open like a canoe but should be paddled like a kayak with a double bladed paddle. They also handle more like a kayak, so let's just call them Hot Dogs! Hotdogs are more fun than any other boat for playing in rivers without needing the skill level demanded for a kayak. You can fit all your gear in a small car and just have a ball with these. When rafting we usually take a couple along and it is often tough to get anyone to row the raft! We really like this design; the ribbed inflatable floor seems to be the key to their success. Sea Eagle Explorers have supported double layer PVC material which makes them far superior to any unsupported boat. The Tahiti is made from specially formulated unsupported PVC material, which seems to hold up pretty well and the limited (no rental or professional use) 12-month warranty protects you against seam problems. Beware of much cheaper boats, they are usually poor quality and don't last. All the Tahiti models have built-in inflation gauges so you won't over-inflate them. If the gauge gets old and stops working reliably, use your lung power for final inflation - that's just about the right amount of air. We recommend the #760 Sevylor pump or #206 NRS pump for inflation. For paddles; use either the #605 NRS or the #606 Carlisle paddle.

#### 752 K-69 TAHITI

This size is excellent for one person or one person and gear. The best whitewater paddling technique is to sit far forward and put your gear (if any) behind you. Specifications are 9'6" length, 2'8" width, 9'½" dia. tubes, 4" bow and stern rise, 3 air chambers with air gauges and one inflatable/adjustable seat. 



### 813 ALUMINUM POT PLIERS


These are well designed because they have a good grip and the gripping angle lets you lift without getting scorched. They are compact, light (4 oz.) and have a grab loop for wire handles. If you don't buy the tongs, try those slip groove waterpump-type pliers from your local hardware store. In fact, try the pliers anyway, because they are much better for most river uses than regular pliers. \$2.75


#### 814 10" ALUMINUM GRIDDLE



This is the one that we use the most because with its 10" x 18" size there is enough room to cook bacon and eggs for a large party. Includes carry handle, still only weighs 3 lbs.

Mirro makes this heavy gauge grate designed to get your cooking pots off the fire. We've also found it excellent for steaks, but the rungs are a little far apart (2") for hamburgers. #### 819 **SCOTCH BOX**


I've never seen anything like this before. It's a box with a grate and a lid. Resembles a tool chest. Also has short legs so you won't scorch the ground. You line it with foil, fire up your charcoal, and start cooking. Finished - just close the lid and snuff out the fire. Save the charcoal for next time. You can carry your ashes out in it - required on some rivers. Comes complete with handle, latch, grill, etc. Color black, 8" x 17" x 61/2". \$15.00

#### **PEAK 1 BACKPACKER STOVE**

Coleman knows stoves, and their backpacking stove is super. Although designed for packpackers, we feel that this is a perfect small stove for river use. Its light weight and compact size make it very easy to pack, either in a kayak or a raft. It burns Coleman fuel efficiently and is relatively easy to operate. Comes complete with instructions, folding legs, integral windscreen and pan support. Even if you take a larger stove for cooking, this one is handy for coffee in the morning. Dimensions are 61/2"H x 5" x 5", weighs 31 \$31.00 OZ.

#### **PEAK 1 CONTAINER** 822

This two-piece Aluminum case holds your Peak 1 stove, doubles as a pair of cook-pots, and even includes a pair of lightweight pot tongs. You need something to carry your stove in, so why not get a product designed for the job, and two cook-pots to boot? (Clean containers thoroughly before using for food to remove traces of fuel.) Weighs 10 oz.



#### **LEXAN TABLEWARE**

Plastic picnicware has many advantages for river trips, but is made of Polystyrene el cheapo - bottom-of-the-line material. Now at last International Silver has made good Permanentware out of top-of-the-line, Polycarbonate, trade name Lexan - just about the toughest material around. A set weighs less than two ounces (about 1/4 of metal silverware) and of course won't rust. Get yourself a set and keep them forever! Place setting consists of knife, (won't take the place of your Swiss Army Knife) fork, spoon and soup \$1.50 set spoon.

#### 825 **SVEN SAW**

Requiring fire pans for river use makes a saw, which was formerly just a nice optional item, almost a necessity. The Sven saw folds and slides into itself, making a package just 1/2" x 2" x 21" (saw teeth are covered so they can't cut or puncture anything!) This is the only compact saw that we know of that also cuts wood easily. Weighs less than 1 lb. \$9.00

#### 826 **SVEN SAW EXTRA BLADE**

Blades can get broken, so here is a spare. \$2.75

#### 830 **SUN SHOWER**

A very clever water bag with one clear and one black side. (Black absorbs all the sun's rays for quicker heating.) Comes complete with hose, on-off control, shower head and a "ready" temperature gauge. On my last trip everyone with hair (not me) was just waiting for the Sun-Shower and I lost it overboard. Very popular item - very unpopular boatman. Take one of these along on your next trip and be a hero - if you tie it on! Fill this vinyl unit with 21/2 gallons cold water - and in a couple of hours its hot. Clever and practical.

#### 832 **POTABLE AQUA**

Is the water quality getting worse on our rivers? I don't think so, but our awareness of all those nasty bugs is increasing. There are very few rivers you can safely drink. Best to carry your own water, but when you run out, have a bottle of these germicidal tablets along to be safe. A Potable Aqua tablet in a quart of questionable water makes it usable in just 10 minutes. Bottle of 50 tablets.

#### 833 STING-EZE

Yellow jackets are a real problem on some Idaho rivers and most of us get stung several times; Pat swears by this stuff to reduce the discomfort. Keep it in your pocket; don't bury it in your bag! Good for all stinging insects. 1/2 ounce bottle.

#### **PLASTISEAM SEALER**


Sealing seams on tents, tarps, jackets, etc. is a real drag because it takes forever. That's why manufacturers don't do it for you. Plastiseam has an easy to use applicator that goes on many times faster than the seam sealers. Since being introduced to this product my friends won't use any other. It can also be used to repair small (one inch or less) tears. Waterproofs even when fabric is wet. Easy to use, no mess applicator. Plastic 2 oz. roll-on dispenser. \$2.25

#### 840 THERMA-REST MATTRESS

Why didn't I think of this one? Open cell foam makes a good pad, but is bulky. Air mattresses are cold and uneven, but fold up into a small bundle. These people put a very light open cell foam in a nylon air mattress and it's neat! You just unroll it, open the valve, and it sucks the air in! Give it a couple of puffs if you want it a little firmer and close the valve. To pack, open the valve, roll it up tightly and close the valve. It stays rolled and slips into a plastic case only 4" in diameter. Coated nylon twill, 47" x 19" x 1½", weighs only 24 oz. \$32.00

#### 842 THERMA-REST EXPEDITION

Nothing expedition about this. It should be called the "Old Softie" and I for one prefer full size to the shortie above. Coated nylon twill, 72" x 20" x 1½", weighs 2-½ lbs. \$42.50



#### 950 WHITEWATER RAFTING

This is the best book we have ever seen on rafting. It has more worthwhile information than any other book, and includes some really good tips on rowing a raft. For the novice, this book is indispensable. Bill McGinnis has good sections on equipment, reading and running whitewater, water emergencies, etc. The only "picky" criticism we have is that McGinnis doesn't think much of using small and light-duty boats for river running. But then again his information is for real heavy-duty trips; aside from this, we have to say this is the best book ever on the subject. This book should clearly be a rafters first purchase. \$5.95

#### 951 RIVER RAFTING

Cecil Kuhne has written a good, fairly simple book on rafting. Contains lots of information for the beginner offered in a simple step-by-step approach; not as comprehensive as Whitewater Rafting. \$4.95

### 952 RIVER RUNNING

Verne Huser has many years of experience in running and guiding river trips. His book offers a lot of good information, although it is oriented towards going on a commercial raft trip rather than taking your own trip. Like Whitewater Ratting, this book slights the use of small and inexpensive rafts. \$4.95

# 953 GUIDE TO INFLATABLE CANOES & KAYAKS

River running is in for some changes. Inflatables are perfect for shorter trips, smaller cars, public transportation, etc. and they are fun. They are the most light-hearted enjoyable boats around. William Sanders writes a wonderfully entertaining book, well done and appropriate to become the Bible of the sport. We have slighted inflatables in the past - don't you make the same mistake. Get this book and get ready for a summer of fun at a relatively modest price. We recommend inflatables, and this book is clearly the place to start.

This book has 15 chapters and 15 authors, each chapter is written by an expert in a different area of river use. #### 960 YOU, TOO, CAN CANOE

I'm not sure if I like the title, but the book is superb. It is a complete book on river canoeing, and unlike many of the "complete" books, this book offers excellent information on virtually every topic concerning river running. John Foshee has obviously paddled and organized many, many trips and he has brought it all together in a virtual encyclopedia of useful information. Don't be misled; this is an interesting, simple to read and understand book.

#### 962 COMPLETE WILDERNESS PADDLER

Written by James Davidson and John Rugge, this book combines a narrative account of an actual trip with step-by-step information and instruction. We suggest this book if you are into canoeing and want to think about longer trips. It's also more fun to read than most of the other books. \$10.00

#### 966 BOATBUILDER'S MANUAL

This manual covers all the steps and procedures for fiberglass whitewater canoe and kayak building. Read and study this book before you build your own fiberglass boat. \$4.95

#### 967 THE SURVIVAL OF THE BARK CANOE

John McPhee could write about anything and make it interesting. Luckily for us he has written about a trip with Henri Vaillancourt and about Henri's dedication to building bark canoes. #### 970 SNAKE RIVER OF HELLS CANYON

They cover the Snake River Country starting with sections now inundated by Idaho Power's Dams, continuing through the Hells Canyon Recreation Area and down to Lewiston. Their now familiar formula of history trivia and rivers just captivates me every time. For instance, they mention the hard-working ranching couple who lost their land to the Hell's Canyon Recreation Area but "got enough money to burn a wet mule."



# SPOTLIGHT-LOWER SALMON RIVER

The Lower Salmon River stretches from the town of Riggins, Idaho, 75 miles to its confluence with the Snake River. Beginning at the town of Whitebird, Idaho, the Lower Salmon drops into a primitive desert canyon; class three rapids and large sandy beaches make this section of the river a delightful trip. Recent legislation has removed the Lower Salmon from consideration as a wild and scenic river, bringing the threat of dams and development. Feasibility studies are now forthcoming by power companies and federal water control agencies toward damming the river. At present the Salmon River is totally undammed and an important anadromous fishery as well as a beautiful river for recreational boating. The Lower Salmon is going to need your help if it is to be preserved as a free flowing river.
